

Job Vacancies (ABS Cat No 6354.0)

Latest quarter: May quarter 2017

Release date: 29 June 2017

Next release date: 28 September 2017

The ABS defines a job vacancy as any job available for immediate filling for which recruitment action has been taken. The ABS scope for recruitment action is broader than the vacancy series released by other organisations, such as the Australian Department of Employment.

Data are based on a sample-based survey and are only available in original terms on a jurisdictional level, thus seasonal and irregular factors may affect quarterly movements. These original estimates have high relative standard errors and therefore the results should be interpreted with caution.

Recent performance

The ABS estimated that the number of job vacancies in Tasmania was 2 700 in original terms in the May quarter 2017, up 3.8 per cent from the previous quarter and up 42.1 per cent compared with the May quarter 2016 (Table 1).

In the year to the May quarter 2017, the number of job vacancies in the Tasmanian private sector accounted for 87.0 per cent of the total job vacancy numbers, down 0.4 of a percentage point compared with the preceding year.

The standard error of the estimate of job vacancies in Tasmania in the May quarter 2017 was 400 vacancies. The interpretation of this is that there are around two chances in three that the real value falls within the range of 2 300 to 3 100 vacancies (2 700 vacancies plus or minus one standard error).

There are approximately nineteen chances in twenty that the real value falls within the range 1 900 to 3 500 vacancies (2 700 vacancies plus or minus two standard errors).

The standard error in Tasmanian job vacancies in the May quarter 2017 is equivalent to a relative standard error of 14.8 per cent compared to 4.8 per cent nationally.
