

REGULATION OF LICENSED PROVIDERS UNDER THE GAMING CONTROL ACT 1993

PROVISION	GAMING EQUIPMENT APPROVAL
SECTION OF THE ACT	76ZZG AND 76ZEL

EXPLANATION

A licensed provider must submit for approval gaming equipment used in the operations of its business. Examples of gaming equipment can include central monitoring system hardware and software.

ACT REQUIREMENTS

A licensed provider must not use gaming equipment that is not approved by the Tasmanian Gaming Commission.

The Commission may accept for evaluation gaming equipment and may seek additional information it considers necessary to undertake that evaluation, at a cost to the licensed provider.

The Commission may accept a certificate from an Approved Testing Facility (ATF) that certifies that gaming equipment is of a class that has been approved by the Commission. A licensed provider will be required to engage an ATF for testing of any system changes.

The Commission must not approve gaming equipment for a licensed provider unless it is satisfied that it is suitable for a gaming/or wagering business. The Commission may set, amend and revoke general gaming equipment standards.

TIMEFRAMES

This provision commences immediately a Tasmanian Gaming Licence is issued.

SUGGESTED PROCESS

The process for the approval of gaming equipment changes is unique to each Tasmanian Gaming Licence holder and is to be determined by the Commission in conjunction with each relevant Tasmanian Gaming Licence holder.
