- Lucky envelopes may only be conducted by the holder of a valid minor gaming permit issued by the Tasmanian Liquor and Gaming Commission.
- Lucky envelopes must be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the *Gaming Control Act 1993*, the rules of the authorised game of lucky envelopes, and the conditions of the relevant minor gaming permit.
- Each box of lucky envelope tickets returns a fixed prize payout to ticket purchasers of between 63 and 75 percent of the gross proceeds of ticket sales.
- Lucky envelope proceeds must be used for the lawful purposes of a not-for-profit organisation or a charitable purpose, and not for the private gain or benefit of any person, except by way of charity.

**It is an offence under the *Gaming Control Act 1993* for any person under the age of 18 years to purchase a lucky envelope ticket, or otherwise to participate in the game of lucky envelopes.**
