

Instant Draw Bingo

Authorisations to conduct minor gaming activities, including Instant Draw Bingo are issued subject to the provisions of the *Gaming Control Act 1993* and to any directions given by the Tasmanian Liquor and Gaming Commission. In accordance with the *Gaming Control Act 1993* the rules and conditions of Instant Draw Bingo are as follows:

QUICK FACTS

- A minor gaming permit is required.
- The game must only be conducted in conjunction with bingo sessions.
- Goods are not permitted to be offered as prizes.
- All tickets used in a game shall be sold at the same price and the price of a ticket shall not exceed \$2.00

INSTANT DRAW BINGO GAMES INCLUDE:

1. Get Six and Win
2. Mini Get Six and Win
3. Get Nine and Win

RULES & CONDITIONS:

WHO IS PERMITTED TO CONDUCT INSTANT DRAW BINGO

1. Instant Draw Bingo is to be played at bingo sessions and will be conducted by a minor gaming permit holder.

SALE OF TICKETS

2. The game can be sold for a maximum of \$2.00 per ticket.
3. All tickets are to be sold singularly for the same price.
4. Every ticket sold in a game shall have six (6) or eight (8) numbers (ranging between 1 and 30 or 1 and 90) printed on its face or front.

SUPPLY OF TICKETS

5. Tickets will be supplied by a supplier who is listed on the Roll of Recognised Manufacturers and Suppliers of Gaming Equipment.
6. Tickets will be supplied in sets of 1 000.

OPERATION OF THE GAME

7. Numbers between 1 and 30 or 1 and 90 will be drawn randomly utilising bingo calling equipment as per the current bingo format (refer to the rules and conditions relating to the conduct of bingo). Numbers between 1 and 30 can only be used for the game "Mini Get Six and Win".

8. Each number between 1 and 30 and 1 and 90 will only be drawn once.
9. Numbers will continue to be drawn until a winner is declared.
10. The first player to mark all numbers on their card and advise the caller that they have covered the required numbers from the draw will win.
11. In the circumstance where a player has completed a ticket but has not noticed this fact until another player (or players) has won on a subsequent number, the prize for the particular game will be divided equally between the players concerned.
12. Each set will have a unique serial number and will be individually numbered for accounting purposes. The numbers shall be announced to players immediately before the commencement of the game.

PAYMENT OF PRIZES

13. In the event that there is more than one winner, the prizes will be divided equally.
14. The prizes for each game in the session:
 - (a) shall be paid only from the receipts deriving from the game;
 - (b) shall not be less than fifty percent of the total gross proceeds derived from the game; and
 - (c) shall be paid in cash as soon as practicable after the conclusion of each game.
15. Goods are not permitted to be offered as prizes.

RECORDS TO BE RETAINED

16. The person to whom the permit has been issued shall be responsible for keeping accurate records of all the transactions of each bingo session and such records are to be retained for seven (7) years and may be inspected by any authorised officer of the Commission or any Police Officer.
