Dear Commissioners,

As part of the implementation of the Government's *Future of Gaming in Tasmania* policy, changes to the regulatory model for gaming are required. A consultation paper in relation to the proposed regulatory model is being released today for comment. A media release from the Minister for Finance is expected this afternoon. Prior to introduction to Parliament, an exposure draft of the legislative amendments will also be made available.

As a key stakeholder, I draw your attention to the consultation paper and supporting fact sheets, noting that written submissions are due by 5pm, 18 March 2020. Submissions can be emailed to future.gaming@treasury.tas.gov.au or submitted by mail.

The consultation is focussed on addressing the implementation of the Government's policy through the intended regulatory model. Matters specific to the Government's policy itself are out of scope of this consultation process.
