Objective and Background	<b>Provides instructions on the processes that agencies must follow when a Building and Construction procurement is affected by the Government Building and Construction Training Policy.</b>

- (1) **This instruction applies only to the procurement of building and construction and is to be read in conjunction with other Instructions relating to such procurements which are contained in the 1200 series of the Treasurer's Instructions.**

## **GOVERNMENT BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION TRAINING POLICY**

- (2) **Agencies must ensure that, for all contracts with an awarded value of \$250 000 and over, the contractor has completed and submitted the Compliance Declaration attached to the Tender Form, in relation to building and construction apprentices and trainees.**

The Policy is administered by Skills Tasmania. The Policy is designed to ensure that expenditure on State Government-funded capital and maintenance works contributes to the maintenance of skills within the building and construction industry.

The Policy requires that a minimum of 20 per cent of the total labour hours worked on any State Government-funded building or construction project, including maintenance works, equal to or in excess of \$250 000 in value, be undertaken by apprentices or trainees under a contract of training in a vocation directly related to the building and construction industry.

The Policy applies to head Contractors and all Sub-Contractors.

- (3) **The agency must require the contractor to submit a detailed Interim Compliance Declaration, outlining the names and vocational pathways of all apprentices and trainees employed in compliance with this policy.**

- (4) The agency must require the contractor to submit a Final Compliance Declaration at the completion of the project, together with a Statutory Declaration that it has complied with the policy.
